## <u>School starters for September 2021</u>

It is nearly that time again! Do you have a child born between 1 September 2016 and 31 August 2017? Applications to start primary school open online on the 5<sup>th</sup> November 2020. I will be providing individual tours for parents that must be pre-booked. Please give the school office a ring if you would like to arrange one to see our wonderful school in action. You must submit applications before 15<sup>th</sup> January 2021. Thank you.

<u>Harvest - This year we are supporting the Salvation Army - please see message below:</u> We have been operating our Community Service Programme all throughout lockdown and still are now. We have been very limited to what we have been able to do. We have given out on average 45-50 picnic grab bags each weekday. These have been made up of hand-made sandwiches, bag of crisps, chocolate bar and small carton of fruit juice.

Also we have supplied approx. 40 grocery bags each week to direct callers, as well as delivering 15 - 20 food boxes (referrals from TDC & KCC).

The PCC has agreed we should arrange a church/village school collection for the above 4 items. I will open the church porch (blue door will be locked) from Monday  $5^{th}$  - Saturday  $10^{th}$  October (8:30am to 5:30pm) for villagers to drop in items. These will then be blessed at our Harvest Festival Service on Sunday  $11^{th}$  & they will then be taken to Margate during the following week. The other benefice churches are also being asked if they'd like to join us as are the benefice village schools.

We are also planning to video a virtual Harvest Festival in school and upload the service to our facebook page. We will keep you posted! Have a lovely weekend
