Dear Parents/Carers

December is upon us! We lit the first candle on our advent wreath in worship on Monday and thought about what it means to 'wait' for something. The children learnt that Johann Hinrich Wichern (1808-1881), a Protestant pastor in Germany was the inventor of the modern Advent wreath in the 19th century. During Advent, children at the mission school would ask daily if Christmas had arrived. In 1839, he built a large wooden ring (made out of an old cartwheel) with 20 small red and 4 large white candles. A small candle was lit successively every weekday and Saturday during Advent. On Sundays, a large white candle was lit and the children could see the countdown to Christmas Day.

Ice skating was great fun on Wednesday morning - our minibus enabled us to take a group of children who had displayed the main apsects of our character education. Despite a few falls, all the children persevered and reported that it was 'epic'. The staff enjoyed it too!





We also hosted the HUB KS1 multi-skills on Thursday afternoon in our school hall - Mr Hayes ensured that all the children participated and had fun. The winning school was St Richards - a huge well done to them.
