### Dear parents/carers

## **More Important News**

### Attendance and lateness

Since we came back together after the pandemic, our school attendance has not got back to the previous level of 97%. We need to improve this – absenteeism is having an impact on the learning and progress of pupils who repeatedly miss school. This will be a focus in term 6 and will be discussed at the parent/teacher meetings next week if necessary. It is the legal responsibility of every parent to make sure their child receives education either by attendance at a school or by education otherwise than at a school. This means their child must attend every day that the school is open, except in a small number of allowable circumstances such as being too ill to attend or being given permission for an absence in advance from the school.

For our children to gain the greatest benefit from their education it is vital that they attend regularly and be at school, on time, every day the school is open unless the reason for the absence is unavoidable. It is a rule of this school that pupils must attend every day, unless there are exceptional circumstances and it is the headteacher, not the parent, who can authorise the absence. Look below to see the impact absence has:

### 175 NON SCHOOL DAYS A YEAR

175 days to spend on family time, visits, holidays, shopping, household jobs and other appointments

## Being late for school has many negative consequences:

- Gets the day off to a bad start;
- Increases stress and upset for the child;
- Can lead to the child feeling embarrassed and singled out;
- Affects the child's overall confidence;
- Disrupts the learning of other class members;
- Creates bad habits which could lead to poor attendance;
- Confusion for your child as work or activities might have been started
