This is a great day for the children to be creative and inspired as their new topics are launched. Planned activites and topics are:

Fledglings	Festivals and Celebrations Come dressed up in your favourite party clothes or your favourite dressing up outfit Wow activities – Getting ready for a party!
Robins (year 1)	Could you live in a castle? Come dressed up to school – princesses, princes, knights, ladies in waiting, jesters etc
	Wow activities - Build a castle with the construction equipment. Creating a coat of arms. Weaving a shield. Painting a big castle that will become their role play area
Magpies (year 2)	What makes a good pirate? Children can come dressed as a pirate
	Wow activities – Going on a pirate treasure hunt and making some treasure maps
Owls (year 3)	Would you find a komodo dragon in Ash? Come dressed up as your favourite animal
	Wow activities – Designing clay animals and making animal biscuits
Hawks (year 4)	What was it like to be evacuated in World War 2? Come dressed as an evacuee
	Wow activities – A special excavation and cooking some World War 2 recipes
Eagles (year 5)	Is there anything out there? Children can come dressed as an astronaut, rocket or an alien
	Wow activities – A rocket launch day with the children designing and making rockets
Falcons (year 6)	What makes fantasy magical? Children can dress up as any fantasy character from a story e.g. Harry Potter, witches, wizards, mythical/mystical/unusual creatures etc.
	Wow activities - throughout the day, they will be combining some magical outdoor learning with hands on activities in the classroom.
