Morning Activities		
Maths (1 task per day)	English (1 task per day)	
In Maths this week we move onto 3D shapes. If you have collected your workbooks from school, you can write answers on sheets and stick them neatly into your book. Don't forget a margin, date and title! Before you start this week's work, I highly recommend you watch this: <u>https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=3-QwWFkz5hw</u> It's a great video explaining how we can describe 3D shapes, and it will help refresh your memory on some 3D shape names too.	Since this term's topic is 'Can a camel live in the North Pole?', lots of this week's English will be all about animals and habitats! We'll be using our reading, spelling and grammar skills this week - hopefully these tasks will help you prepare for next week when we're back in school! Monday: <u>1.3.21 LI: To use the suffix '-ness'.</u> Last half term you may remember completing a piece of work on the suffixes -ful and -less. Today, try your hand at using another, '-ness'.	
 Monday: <u>1.3.21 LI: To count faces on 3D shapes.</u> Have a go at completing these questions which require you to count faces (the flat sides) on 3D shapes. You might find it helpful to find objects from around the house in order to help you count - e.g. a cereal box (cuboid), a ball of blue-tack (sphere). 	Tuesday: 2.3.21 LI: To use the past progressive tense and the present progressive tense. So far in Year 2 we've learned about the past, present and future tenses, but now we're going to build on that further by learning about 'progressive' tenses. I've attached a PPT which will show you exactly how to use these before you then complete today's activity.	
 Tuesday: <u>2.3.21 LI: To count edges on 3D shapes.</u> Today you'll need to count the edges on 3D shapes - complete the White Rose questions provided. Wednesday: <u>2.2.21 LT. To count does not a shape of the state </u>	 → Wednesday: <u>3.3.21 LI: To use reading comprehension skills.</u> Have a go at today's reading comprehension - all about elephants! You'll need to use your retrieval skills (finding information in the text) and sequencing skills. 	
3.3.21 LI: To count vertices on 3D shapes. In Maths today, count the vertices on 3D shapes – remember that 'vertices' is another word for 'corners'. N.B: The point on a cone shape is not actually a vertex but instead called an 'apex'.	 Thursday: <u>4.3.21</u> LI: To use reading comprehension skills (ctd). Today, learn about an important biome and animal habitat - the rainforest! Read through the report and answer the questions provided - for this task you'll
