This means that sometimes they are told a little differently. This is because they were never written down, they were simply passed down through generations through story telling. Then, when those children had grown up, they would tell their children the story, and so on. Read another version of the story for today's activity, then discuss with somebody what is the same, and what is different.</p>	<p>Quiet reading for 20 minutes</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><b>PE</b></p> <p>The Ancient Greeks invented the Olympics Games, and their athletes would have trained every day! Create your own athlete training routine using a fidget spinner and the activity sheet. Get a timer, and every time the fidget spinner lands on an activity, you need to do as many reps as you can in 1 minute! Keep going for 10 minutes, then have a rest, then do another ten minutes. If you don't have a fidget spinner, you could spin a pencil instead.</p>
