Year 1 Weekly Home Learning Overview

Week beginning: 22nd February 2021

Weekly Maths Tasks

Monday- To count in 10's: I would like you to start the day by practising counting in your 2's and 5's. Next we are going to start counting up in 10's to help us learn our 10 times tables. This can be tricky so don't worry if you haven't remembered them by the end of today (I'm not expecting you too). Have a go at today's activity and see how you get on.

Tuesday- To compare length and height: Today we are moving on to measurements. Start the day by watching <https://vimeo.com/507943851>, then have a go at today's activity.

Wednesday- To measure objects (1): Today we are going to start measuring objects, however we are going to use cubes to measure. Please watch <https://vimeo.com/508439670> and have a go at today's activity. However, if you do have cubes at home, you can try to measure your own objects and then write about them in your book, for example that pencil is 3 cubes long.

Thursday- To measure objects (2): Today we are continuing to measure objects but we are going to use a ruler today. Start by watching <https://vimeo.com/510394371> and then have a go at today's activity. However, if you have a ruler at home, you can measure objects around your house and then write about them in your book, for example the pen is 4 cm long.

Friday- To add length: To end the week, we are going to try and add two lengths together. Please start by watching <https://vimeo.com/511039862> and then have a go at the activity provided. If you would like a challenge, see if you can create some of your own.

I have included answer sheets for all work sheets.

Weekly English Tasks

This week we are starting our new topic which is 'What is life like in a great city?'

Monday- To describe a scene: Today I would like to look at the picture of the great city of London, what can you see? Make a list of all the things you can see.

Tuesday- To make a prediction: Today I want you to look at the front cover picture on today's activity and then make a prediction. What do you think this story might be about? Who do you think the characters are? After you have made your prediction, listen to the story <https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=ImrNxvC9bb4>, was your prediction correct?

Wednesday- To answer questions about a story: Yesterday we listened to the story 'Katie in London', what did you think of the story? Today I would like you to listen to it again and then see if you can answer questions about the story for today's activity.

Thursday- To retell a story: Now we have listened to the story a few times, I would like to see if you could retell the story using the pictures I have provided.

Friday- To understand how to use capital letters and full stops (SPaG): Today we are going to recap how and when we use capital letters and full stops. I would like you to look at the power points I have attached to remind yourselves when we use them. Next, I would like you to look at today's activity and see if you can add where the capital letters and full stops should be in these sentences.

Ideally you should aim to do two PE sessions a week like we do in school, so have a little look and pick what you would like to do for your P.E sessions.</p> <p>PSHE: From now on I will be including a PSHE activity every week as this is a very important part of our curriculum. There will be a power point and activity uploaded each week. This week we will be looking at dental hygiene.</p>

<p>Science: This term we are looking at seasonal weather and this week we are focusing on Spring. I would like you to view the power point about the changes that happen in Spring and discuss them with an adult. Next, I would like you draw the types of clothes people wear in Spring and label them or to draw what happens to trees and flowers in Spring and write a few sentences describing these changes.</p> <p>RE: This term we are learning about 'Why Easter matters to Christians?'. I would like you to watch this video of 'The Easter story' https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=HL8R158Ujp4. After you have watched this video, I would like you to draw a picture of a cross and underneath write a couple of sentences about why Jesus sacrificed himself to save us (end of the story).</p>	<p>Obviously, this a lot of work for our little Reception Robins so here is some ideas for these children:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Play and interact with the phonics games (phase 2), they have also been added on to the class interactive game. • I have attached another phonics activity booklet, try to do what you can. • Listen to the story of 'Katie in London', what did you think?
