<ul> <li>Monday- To subtract length: To start the week, we are going to try and subtract length. Please start by watching https://vimeo.com/511040266 and then have a go at the activity provided. If you would like a challenge, see if you can create some of your own.</li> <li>Tuesday- To compare weight: Today we are moving on from length and learning about measuring weight. Please start today by looking at the power point provided introducing you to weight and then have a go at the activity.</li> <li>Wednesday- To weigh objects (1): Today we are going to look at how we measure objects using balance scales and cubes. Look at today's activity and have a go.</li> <li>Thursday- Weight and mass problems: Today I would like you to challenge yourselves and have a go at answering some weight and mass problems.</li> <li>Friday- To go on a measurement scavenger hunt: To end the week, we are going to do something a bit different and fun. I have attached a scavenger hunt for you to go on today which is linked to what we have learnt over the last few weeks. Enjoy!</li> <li>I have included answer sheets for all work sheets.</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Monday- To identify features: This week we are going to be writing a postcard imagining that we are Katie. Today we are going to look at the features of a postcard. I would like you to look at the power point I have attached and then make a list of all the key features of a postcard e.g stamp.</li> <li>Tuesday To write a list: Today I would like you to re listen to Katie in London and then write a list of all the places she saw and visited during her day out in London.</li> <li>Wednesday- To plan our postcard: Today I would like you to start planning what will be going in your postcard. I have attached a planning sheet to help you.</li> <li>Thursday- To write about a day out: Yesterday we planned our postcard, today we are going to write our main bit of our postcard? How do we start our postcard? Who are we writing to? Next what did we see? How did we get there? How do we end our postcard? I have attached an example for you to look at.</li> <li>Friday- To create a postcard: Today I would like you to create your postcard, I have attached a template for you. Remember to use your plan from Wednesday and your writing from yesterday to help you. Once you have finished, remember to draw a nice picture on the front of your postcard.</li> </ul>

Spellings/ Handwriting	Topic, PE and PSHE
This week's spellings are: Tape Rude Use Car Arm Were	<b>Geography:</b> This term we are looking at maps. This week I would like you to look at the power point on map symbols and design your own map symbol. If you have an atlas at home, as a challenge, I would like you to see if you can spot any map symbols.
Look, practice these daily, and then ask someone at home to test you at the end of the week. For handwriting, look at the cursive handwriting PowerPoint I have attached and practice writing the letter e this week. I have added the common exception and high frequency words for year 1. I would like you to learn 3-5 words off each list a week and possibly try to write them in a sentence.	<ul> <li>P.E: Mr Hayes has very kindly created a sheet with lots of links and ideas for your PE sessions. He has also made a P.E pack with extra ideas (I have attached both). Ideally you should aim to do two PE sessions a week like we do in school, so have a little look and pick what you would like to do for your P.E sessions.</li> <li>PSHE: From now on I will be including a PSHE activity every week as this is a very important part of our curriculum. There will be a power point and activity uploaded each week. This week we will be looking at staying safe at home.</li> </ul>
Science and RE	Reception
<ul> <li>Science: This term we are looking at seasonal weather and this week we are focusing on Spring. I would like you to carry out an investigation this week to investigate weather in Spring. Every day, I would like you to write down what the temperature is and write a short description about the weather that day for example today is sunny and cloudy. Use the grid I have attached.</li> <li>RE: I would like you to re watch this video of 'The Easter story' <u>https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=HL8R158Ujp4</u>. After you have watched this video, I would like you to think about how it made you feel? What part made you feel sad? What part made you feel happy? For your activity I would like you to write how the story made you feel and why, once you have done this, I would like you to draw another picture of a cross but colour it in with the colours linked to how you feel.
