Stories you could read at home;

- 'The Lighthouse Keeper's Lunch', 'Sharing a Shell', 'Ten Little Pirates', 'Commotion in the Ocean', 'The Rainbow Fish', 'Lucy and Tom at the Seaside' and any others you can find.

Activities you might like to try;

- Visit your local beach to find some seaside treasures – shells, stones, sea glass, driftwood, seaweed, rope...what else can you find?
- Can you make a list of the things you see, hear, smell, touch and taste at the beach?
- Make a large (or small) collage picture using your seaside treasures.
- Take some photos of your visits to the seaside and talk with your family about what you like best about the beach – can you write about your visit?
- Learn a Seaside rhyme or poem and have a go at making your own!
- Can you learn this tongue twister – "She sells sea shells on the sea shore!" Now keep repeating it and see how fast you can say it!
- Bake some 'sea shell biscuits' and make a tasty picnic to enjoy when you go to the beach.
- Design your own ice cream sundae – what flavours would you like best?
- Paint or draw a seaside picture – you could put boats, mermaids or pirates in the picture!
- Write a postcard to a friend telling them all about your visit to the beach.
- Using your seaside treasures, can you count them all up? Can you add and subtract them to make different totals. Can you think of ways to record your sums?
- Can you sort your treasures into different groups according to their size, shape, colour etc.

Activities to keep practising;

- **Phonics** – keep practising reading and writing the letters and sounds from phase 2 and 3. Can you write any seaside words using your phonic skills...remember to use robot arms!!
- **Handwriting** – see if you can keep practising your name writing and letters of the alphabet. Think about your pencil grip and using the correct formation to write the letters.
5 minutes of handwriting every day will really help you!
- **Number Work** - Practise counting up to 20 and beyond, write the numbers and use them to practise adding and subtracting sums, there are lots of games available online to help you with this.
