Dear Parents/Carers

We have officially had the last full week in school for this academic year and we break up tomorrow. What a year it has been! Arrangements for September

Whilst it is difficult to plan for September as there has been much uncertainty around guidance etc we have made a plan based on the current situation and discussed this at our most recent staff meeting. The children are back in school on Thursday 2nd September. KS1 will continue to go in independently through the main entrance from 8.35am - 8.45am and KS2 will continue to go in through the side gate from 8.35am - 8.45am - this leaves teachers free to plan and get ready for their morning lessons without interruptions. EYFS will continue to be

dropped off in Fledglings garden from 8.40 onwards. Pick up will be outside the classes as per pre-pandemic - 3.10 for Fledglings and 3.15 for the rest of the school (parents to walk across the playground and the gate will open just before 3.15pm) - this will enable teachers to have any necessary catch up with parents. We have found that the children coming into school wearing their PE kit on PE days has been a success so we will continue with this. Mr Hayes will continue to cover the teachers' PPA time and will also continue to support with PE teaching/events across the school.

I will of course keep you updated should the situation change. I do thank you all for the support you have given the school during the pandemic - we have had to make changes at very short notice and your patience and understanding has certainly made my job much easier.

PTFA update

Thank you for your support of the fair today, we hope the children enjoyed the afternoon. Key stage 1 alone has made £400 from early contributions and we await the total from Key stage 2 - find out next week!

Also a huge thank you to all of the C&K families and friends who have supported the events we have been able to run this school year. It's been a reduced calendar of events due to Covid but we are so pleased we were able to offer some fun events and activities for the children to enjoy.

All funds raised from PTFA events go back into the school to fund projects, trips, supplies and initiatives for the children.
