We have a parent governor vacancy at our school and are in a position to formally elect a Parent Governor onto the Governing Body. This is a rewarding volunteer position.

When nominating someone or yourself, you may want to know more about what is involved; Governors do not need to be experts in the field of education, what is needed is an interest in the welfare of students together with the time and willingness to be involved. Your skills may be very useful as part of the Governing Body. Governors need to build relationships with a range of people, to be able to work as part of a team, to be able to question and the ability to make connections between different types of information.

The Governing Body is responsible for supporting the vision for the school and ensuring that the school works effectively towards achieving the vision. It does this by building a thorough knowledge of the school and its community. The Governing Body is made up of Parent Governors, Staff Governors, Foundation Governors and a Local Authority Governor. Free school meals

We are encouraging parents to apply for free school meals if you think your child is eligible. Your child may be eligible for Free School Meals if you are in receipt of the following: • Universal Credit - if you apply on or after 1st April 2018 your household income must be less than £7,400 a year (after tax and not including any benefits you receive)

- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- $\boldsymbol{\cdot}$ Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- $\boldsymbol{\cdot}$ Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of Pension Credit
- \cdot Child Tax Credit (provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual

gross income of no more than £16,190)

• Working Tax Credit run-on - paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit.
